# **Starry Night**



This project explores the differences in the world at night compared to during the day. It teaches children about the importance of a good night's sleep, and helps them to discover what is happening in the world while they are sleeping, including finding out about nocturnal animals. The Planetarium visit makes links to night time, stars and moon and other planets. Children will also be learning about winter and seasonal changes in our companion project 'Winter Wonderland'. This will include stories and science play experiences.
